RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The study of the presence of phytomorphic motifs in Romanian traditional art was evaluated based on the analysis of the textile pieces that are the object of the traditional costume. The phytomorphic motifs have an active presence in the textile pieces and those of the Romanian traditional costume. The analysis of the museum pieces and the bibliographic sources in this sense [1, 2] allowed to establish the presence of the phytomorphic motifs presented in table 1.
